Message from the Desk of Jim Dill

Forest Lake Estates Homeowners' Association (FLEHOA) President

I really thought we were beginning to wind down, but March has been really busy. This is the last month before most of our activities come to a close. We will have our last Fish Fry and Sandwich Night in April. Bingo will continue through the last week of April. We will have one last large Newsletter in May and then we begin our summer activities. If anyone wants to be involved in supporting summer activities, please contact Mike and Kera Reid, Carolyn Keithley, or any other Board Member.



Here is a quick summary of key items and events from March:

- In a one week period we had three bicycles stolen from the park. You may want to either lock them up or put them in your shed overnight. If you do have something stolen, please contact Pasco County Sheriff and they will send someone out. I did discuss this with Steve and talked about how insecure the code we have for the front gate is. Over the summer he will contact his security contractor and we will work together on other options. I will keep you all advised of any actions.
- There have been lots of concerns about the temperature of the large pool. We did have a motor burn out about 3 weeks ago and it has been replaced. The large pool contains 150,000 gallons of water and it loses its temperature pretty quickly when we have these very cold nights. And then it takes a few days for the temperature to come back to normal. Please be patient and as soon as we start getting the warmer temperatures all day then the issue should go away. Steve and his team are constantly on this issue.
- On March 15th ELS did some videotaping of many of our activities. They will use this video for marketing and mobile home/RV shows. The event started at 8 AM and finished around 4 PM. Feedback from Steve and his marketing person from Tampa was that the HOA did an outstanding job supporting this event and staging all the activities. They also said this was the best support they have received from an HOA. Thanks to all who volunteered their time to come out and support. WE had about 100 volunteers attend. Once we get a copy of the video in a couple months, we will put it on our web site.
- Our 2018 Patio Party was a <u>HUGE</u> success. We gave out about 770 tickets in advance and we counted 670+ tickets of residents getting meals. Again, this would not have been so successful without the support of many volunteers.

MEET the McLean's of 6313 Spring Lake Circle...

Al and Marjorie Mc Lean first came to Forest Lake Estates to visit his brother, Don who bought in FLE in 1992. At the time he and Marjorie owned a condo in Fort Myers but after visiting he and Marjorie rented for five years here in FLE before buying their home in 2004.

Marjorie is the oldest of three children with two sisters and one brother now deceased. Al is the youngest of seven children consisting of five boys and two girls. Both Marjorie and Al had been married before with children of those marriages. Marjorie had 3 children, Darrin, Angela, and Christine. Sadly, Christine died at age 3½ after being hit by a car while playing outside. Al thru his

prior marriage has four children, Gary, who lives here in FLE and is the only son, and three daughters, Nancy, Sandra, and Patsy. Al met Marjorie when he took his boat for a ride and found himself in need of a place to dock. The dock owner advised Al there was a vacant slip possibly available for rent while that boat was out for repair. The owner of that slip was a friend of Marjorie's.

It could well be said that Al's introduction to Marjorie was inevitable. They began dating in 1975 and on October 26, 1979 they were married. Together, Marjorie and Al have 14 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren.

At the time Al and Marjorie met in 1975, Al was a dairy farmer on the family farm in Barrie, Ontario, Canada while he was also involved in municipal politics. While politics took a stronghold on Al's life and career, his rural roots feature prominently starting with his upbringing on a cattle farm in what was then Oro Township. His father sold milk to a Barrie-based dairy, shipping the product in large cans "cooled in the back shed of

the house with Lake Simcoe ice from their icehouse." Following in his father's footsteps, Al went on to purchase his 1st farm in 1959. His grandson is successfully running that farm yet today. That farming operation, while undergoing numerous changes throughout the years, had the highest producing dairy herd in the County of Simcoe and the highest producing cow in all of Canada.

Al's career took a sharp turn when he went into a life of politics in December, 1963. He ran for and was elected to a seat on the Municipal Council. Since then he has served as Reeve, Deputy Reeve, and Warden, has served on all legislature committees and chaired two. At one time, Al was Chief Government Whip, the equivalent of the U.S. Speaker of the House.

Highlights of Al's illustrious career:

Election to Warden of County Council Being elected as Speaker of Parliament (by colleagues) AS MPP, his business meetings with various countries Meeting with Senators and Members of Congress in U.S.A. Meeting with Massachusetts Governor Dukakis In Sacramento as Ed Skelton addressed Congress Meeting in Cleveland, Ohio for Speakers only Washington meeting with Senators and Congress In England, meeting with the House of Lords As Speaker, meeting Kuala Lumpur in Malaysia (speakers only from many different countries) Travel to Melbourne, Australia and Hong Kong

Travel to Melbourne, Australia and Hong Kong Retired in 1999, Al proudly served 41 years in Public Life, having won 19 elections, and served as Chairman of Finance,

County and Provincial. Al published his memoirs in "The Farmer Politician".

Al & Marjorie continue to lead an active life here at FLE so when you see them walking, or engaged in an event, stop by and say hi. If you don't know them, introduce yourself. They are an asset to FLE. Page 6

Be a Real-Life SUPERHERO for Abused, Abandoned and Neglected Children

Children in our Community Need Your Help! Domestic violence, substance abuse and mental health issues are some of the reasons there are so many children who have been taken from their parents and placed into the Dependency system (sometimes known as the foster care system). There are currently over **1000** children in Pasco County alone in the Dependency system. Out of those, there are **over 500** abused, neglected or abandoned children still waiting for someone to be their voice....to be



their SUPERHERO. That someone is a Guardian ad Litem volunteer whose mission is to speak up for a child's best interest to ensure they *thrive*, and not simply survive. A Guardian ad Litem is a volunteer appointed by the court to advocate for the best interest of an abused, neglected or abandoned child. They are the voice of the child. Research shows that children, who have a Guardian ad Litem, spend less time in foster care, do better in school and have a much better chance of being reunited with their parents or getting adopted than those who do not.

Everyone is familiar with SUPERHEROES like Batman, Spiderman and Cat Woman. However, SUPERHEROES are not solely found on the big screen. By definition, a SUPERHERO is *"one who has special strength or powers and uses it to fight evil, do good things and help other people"*. Being the voice of a child and ensuring that their best interests are served, is indeed a special power that can be used to help these children experience normalcy, be treated fairly and obtain a permanent home more quickly. And, it only takes an average of 8 - 10 hours per month! There are four simple steps to becoming a Guardian ad Litem "SUPERHERO" volunteer:

1) Attend one of the weekly Information Sessions

Information Sessions are held each Tuesday at 10:30am and 6pm at the New Port Richey office, located at 8324 Corporate Way, NPR, FL 34653. To view dates and register, visit the calendar of events at www.herotoachild.org to register or call 727-834-3493. Sessions are also held monthly at the Dade City Library and Land O'Lakes Library (check w/library for exact dates).

2) Complete an online application after attending an Information Session

3) Participate in an interview

4) Attend Training

<u>YOU CAN</u> make a life long difference in the life of a child! Will you volunteer as a Guardian ad Litem and be the SUPERHERO for an abused, abandoned or neglected child? If not YOU, then WHO?

RECYCLING COMMITTEE REPORT

Recycling in our park is going well. Groups of people are car-pooling to take other items to the East Pasco Transfer Station on Rte 579N (Handcart Road). Thank you all for volunteering to monitor the bins and for people to conscientiously bring their paper and cardboard to the bins.



PAPER RECYCLING

Paper and cardboard can be brought to bins near Post Office on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, 10:00 to 12:00.

Cardboard must be broken down. **NO other items**, no plastic bags, no Styrofoam, no garbage. Bins are locked at all other times. Glass, Plastic, Metal, Paper, Cardboard Bring to the East Pasco Transfer Station on Handcart Rd (579N). No need to sort, dump all into one bin. Turn left out of park onto Pasco Co 54 W (becomes Eiland Blvd) Drive 6.9 miles, turn right onto 579N. (Handcart Rd) Go about 3.9 miles, station is on the right. Furniture, and appliances for free. TV's are \$5 or \$10. Call them at 352-521-0500 if you have any questions. Set up a group with your neighbors and friends to take turns going there. NO PLASTIC BAGS IN BIN.

So... what IS Music in the Park?

If you are anywhere near the Forest Lake Estates clubhouse and hear sweet sounds wafting from inside, chances are you're listening to one of our many "Music in the Park" groups.



The Music in the Park committee was formed eight years ago, but we still often hear the question: *"What exactly IS Music in the Park?"* So, here's a little "then and now" info all about our committee!

In the beginning

Music has been an important part of FLE since the first choral group was formed 21 years ago. The group was reorganized in 2001 as the "Sounds of Silver Chorus" (SOS) under the direction of Constance McKay, rehearsing weekly and performing two concerts each year. The SOS raised revenues that funded not only sheet music, but also instruments and equipment that we continue to enjoy today, including the current piano, the choral risers (stage) and sound equipment, and the tone chimes for the Forest Lake Chimers group.

Continuing the legacy

After Constance retired and no replacement could be found, the Music in the Park committee was formed to support musical activities in the park. The committee has added to the SOS legacy, raising funds through donations at musical events and through our fall yard sale, to purchase additional sound equipment and the acoustic stage curtain, and even a television and video projector. As fundraising is our only source of income to allow us to purchase this equipment, we appreciate everyone who has contributed donations at performances and events!

The park is alive... with the sound of music!

Music in the Park makes many musical events possible for FLE residents to enjoy, including the Christmas Sing-Along, Variety of Talents Showcase, FLE Chimers, Karaoke Sing-Along, Music Jams, and the Open Mic Night. Music in the Park also makes our equipment available to other activities, operated by our trained volunteers.

Recent changes in our community and the show of support from the new HOA and ELS have been encouraging. The addition of the divider in the clubhouse should lead to even more musical activities and other activities in our park. It would be great to have a chorus again, we just need an organizer and a director!
