Grimsley's in our Park!

Today I thought we'd take a trip down memory lane. How many of you stayed up late on Saturday nights as youths or even young adults to watch the late night horror shows? And can any of you remember the tv show "Host of Horrors" or do you recall the name "Grimsley"? Well allow me to introduce you to the man who with his father's help, created the character "Grimsley" and comes from quite a family of famous television and movie star actors, actresses, directors and producers.

Robert Foster was born September 23, 1948 to Norman Foster and Sally (Baines) Young-Foster and currently resides on Utopia Drive here in FLE with his wife Stephanie Payne Foster. Robert's only sibling was his beautiful & much adored older sister, Gretchen, a former model and world traveler



who sadly passed away last year, 2017. Gretchen was named after Robert's & Gretchen's famous aunt, Loretta Young. That's right. Robert's mother was Gretchen Young's sister whose name was changed to Loretta for stage at her agent's advice.

As a youth, Robert attended Loyola High School of Los Angeles, a Jesuit preparatory school for young men. It is today

the oldest high school and continuously run educational institution in Southern California. He continued his education at Loyola College where he realized his true ambition was to follow in his parents' footsteps on stage. Robert says he literally grew up on Disney sets watching his dad while he worked with Walt Disney and Fess Parker as Director in the creation of the "Davy Crockett" television series. His father's legacy is long as he began his career while working as a reporter in New York. There he met and married his first wife, Claudette Colbert which too soon ended in divorce and after which he began dating Loretta Young. While waiting for Loretta one evening, Norman Foster, was introduced to her sister, Sally. It was love at first sight and Loretta was all but forgotten when he married Sally Young. His acting career was in high gear as he played the son of Will Rogers in the original movie "State Fair". One time while on location with "Zorro" Robert's dad affectionately referred to him as "the

Robert's mother, Sally Young, left her own legacy in the acting world working with such great stars as Cary Grant and Don Ameche, Spencer Tracy, Clark Gable, David Niven, Franchot Tone and Bela Lugosi. She began her career in silent movies and starred in "the Shiek" with Rudolph Valentino as an Arab child.

little bastard". HE says... "Twit that I was, I saved his life that day!"

She performed in as many as 98 films including the 1933 production of the "Night of Terror" with Bela Lugosi and W.C. Fields in "Fools for Luck." Sadly, Robert lost his mother when she passed away August 27, 1997.

As a young man, Robert found himself in New York City, taking residence in darkened hotel rooms to sleeping in phone booths when eventually, showing all the signs of malnutrition and Beriberi was sent home. After recovery, while waiting for a job interview at a local television station, he overheard some mailroom chatter. "Who's that?" followed by the response, "Some big shot from New York." That big shot from New York had been homeless, wandering the streets of the Bowery. Before long, the station owner wanted to meet him. It was Gene Autry who gave him his own Halloween Special... a 2 hour time slot in prime time. The old Gunsmoke set was magically transformed into the "Grimsley Mortuary. While sneaking into a local cemetery for a photo shoot to somehow entice TV Guide for their cover, we noticed an open grave nearby. At the same time a group of schoolchildren happened to come by. They took one look at Grimsley in his rotting coattails climbing out of the ground and took off, screaming at the top of their lungs for their lives! "One of the highlights was when Robert was working inside the Stretch & Hold Room for entry to the Haunted Mansion. As a young girl approached him, she commented, "I hope you don't take this the wrong way, but you look as if you belong here." It was one of the greatest compliments he ever received. House rules didn't allow him to tell her he was indeed one of the characters she would meet inside the Haunted Mansion.

Near pathological shyness did not help at personal appearances, but one evening, a mother and her daughters arrived, all with severe facial disfigurements after a horrid fire. And there they were... posing with Grimsley and taking pictures.

Robert feels he learned a very profound lesson in the space of a few camera flashes that day... "Beauty is indeed in the eye of the beholder"! He made certain to kiss each one of them before leaving that day. After that, viewers would write Grimsley with the most heart rending stories of personal travesties... the human abyss. Some way, they had seen through the wicked persona of Grimsley or perhaps because he was so horrid, they felt they could open up to him.

"Grimsley. Those were the days," remarks Robert. Television ratings were virtually life and death with real competition and so few stations. There were roughly 750,000 viewers on a good night. Robert claims he had Gene Autry to thank for the first show, taped on the old "Gunsmoke" set. He made Grimsley's armchair with a prop found on the lot and one night while watching "The Ten Commandments"... there it was again... in a key scene! It was the copper mirror! From Grimsley to the Ten Commandments! Amazing!

Robert signed the contract to play Grimsley literally 8 hours after his father passed. It was Robert's father who had reshaped the character, refining him to an exquisitely rotten person. Prior to his passing, Robert asked his father for details of how he'd like his estate handled. His father's response: "I would like Grimsley to conduct my funeral. Norman Foster passed away July 7, 1976 leaving a legacy as an actor, film director and screen writer and had made 141 films, 52 as an actor, and 89 as Director, Just for comparison, his production of "Davy Crockett" was a world wide phenomenon... and according to Leonard Matlin... much bigger than Star Wars!

Robert continued his acting career through the years and recalls one of his major roles as that of "Scrooge" in the Albert Finney movie, "Scrooge". Once,

after a performance of Scrooge on stage, children were waiting to meet him and had collided, leaving one with a bloody nose. The parents mistakenly thought that Scrooge had punched the little boy in the face. Another time, after a performance and the matinee curtain had closed, there was no applause... only a distinct clicking sound coming from the audience. Looking beyond the curtain, Robert realized there were no theatre seats... all had been replaced with wheelchairs with children with prosthetics for arms, and hands, and enthusiastically clanging their hooks together. He was overcome with emotion.



We held a Recycling Committee meeting on Tuesday January 16th and had 22 interested people attend.






