Phyllis also held a position on the Social Club Board of Directors. Sadly, Dick passed away in 2013 after 65 ½ years of wedded bliss.

I hope you all had a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. May you have a blessed 2018 and it be filled with the joys of love, peace, and prosperity.

Important note regarding our new Automatic External Defibrillator (AED)

The AED has been installed in the clubhouse near the main entrance. Hopefully it will never be needed, but if it is required, it is easy to use. The unit your HOA purchased has three ways of giving usage info – voice, text and video.

Two things to remember though:

- 1. If someone is having what might be a cardiac event; have someone call 911 and provide the 911 dispatcher (in a calm and precise manner) the information they ask for.
- 2. Go get the AED, turn it on and follow its directions. Please remember using an AED by itself is not enough. CPR MUST be initiated. For those persons who are appropriately trained, apply CPR along with rescue breathing.

The AED your HOA purchased is a Defibtech Lifeline View.

Rules for Outdoor Kitchen and Grill Usage

- Call 213-313-9372 (Toni Beaton) or 813-997-6523 (Eileen Lane) to reserve a date for when you want to use the grill (no earlier than 3 weeks in advance)
- Must make \$50 deposit at time of reservation to hold date and time and to ensure full clean up
- Meet Toni or Eileen on patio on day of reservation to unlock grills, receive cooking tools, go over cleaning procedures, and give contact name and phone number
- > Trash must be placed in the bins in the parking lot by kitchen door
- Must clean grills after use, clean up all food areas and all tables used
- Place table and chairs back to how you found them
- Agree when to meet again for cleaning inspection, turning in cooking utensils, and receiving deposit . Grills will be relocked after event
- ➤ If your party includes people from outside, the organizer of the party is responsible for all nonresidents' behavior


