Message from the Desk of Rick Schlager

Forest Lake Estates Homeowners' Association (FLE HOA) President

Many of our good friends and relatives are returning to Forest Lake Estates for the winter. It has already gotten cold and some white stuff has been falling in the northern regions of our country and Canada. Please give everyone a warm Florida welcome on their return.



We look forward to a monthly calendar full of social and athletic events around the park this coming

season. Putt-Putt has already started along with Bingo and Ice Cream Social. Mid November will start dinner dances, Monday night sandwiches, Pizza and Wing night along with a monthly Fish Fry. Check your newsletter and calendar for dates and times.

We continue to receive comments and complaints on a number of issues. These issues are not new but have plagued FLE probably since it's inception. Issues such as speeding, not stopping at stop signs, parking on sidewalks, too many animals at a home site, size of animals at a homesite, cleanliness of sidewalks in the common areas, cleaniness of a residents' home, abundance of weeds around a residents' home.

Rules were put in place to protect all residents in the park, not just a few. The rules are posted in the clubhouse on the wall between the poolside double doors and the kitchen door. These rules were a collaboration between the FLE Board of Directors and ELS. The rules were then submitted to the State of Florida for approval. In the month of December, the Board of Directors will meet with ELS Upper Management to work out a resolution to as many of the issues I have talked about and the enforcement of the approved rules. We will seek to implement a better system of control and compliance with the rules and regulations via the complaint process that ELS has put implemented.

It is the responsibility of each and every resident to file a complaint to the office when there are situations of flagrant abuse of the rules and regulations, whether that abuse is from a resident or a guest of a resident or workmen that were contracted by a resident. It is the Board's responsibility to work closely with ELS and set up adequate procedures to monitor those complaints to seek resolution and closure. This will be the Board's goal during the next couple months.

Membership sales will begin on Monday, November 4th from 10:00 AM to 12 Noon and every Monday through Mid-January. The dues are \$20 per household per year. The dues monies go into our general fund for operating expenses, activities and legal support. Members who provide an email address will receive the monthly newsletter, minutes of membership meeting and any announcements via email. You may choose to have a hardcopy newsletter delivered to. your home November to April Newsletters are only delivered in the summer to members without email.

An election will be held in January to elect directors to the Board. You must be a member to run for election or vote.

- Pets must be on a leash when outside and it must be supervised at all times.
- Following speeders is NEVER a good idea as it could cause altercations among neighbors. All violations should be reported to the office in writing.
- Alterations Please allow 15 days to receive an answer on the exterior modification forms (we are getting forms wanting to be approved the same day). The form must be completed entirely, returned to the office, and with a sketch/drawing of the proposed project.
- Management Office Policy NO SHIRT, NO SHOES, NO SERVICE.
- Resident Referral Program Residents will receive a \$2,500 referral fee if they refer a friend to purchase the new house on Jessup. The listed price is \$105,500.
- Entrance Gate We are planning to start working on the gate upgrade on November 18th. The gates will be down for a few weeks while the upgrades take place.

On Sunday, December 22nd from 5:30 to 8:00 pm a group of volunteers will be traveling throughout some of this park, (mostly in golf carts) to bring Christmas cheer to our neighbors who are less able to get out to other Christmas activities. Our main objective is to ensure that they feel included in our circle of friendship, and to be physically present to them by singing a few Christmas carols, and gifting them with some sweet treats. You are most welcome to join us, by meeting in the clubhouse parking lot between 5:15 and 5:30 that evening. We then proceed on a pre-determined route throughout the park. If you do not



have a golf cart, perhaps you could arrange to ride along with someone who does.....the more the merrier.

Last year we visited over 25 homes. As you can imagine, this takes some time and organization to do, so I hope you can help me as the planning process begins. If you know of someone who is in need of some extra Christmas cheering, please ask them if they would like us to carol for them that evening. If they agree, and it is convenient for them, then just call me (Lenore) at 813-395-5185 with their name, address and phone number so I can add them to our list. If you are the one who would like us to visit, please just call me. You are precious too. Once the list is complete, (please...please...no later than Thursday, Dec. 19th), I then map out our route, call the resident with an estimated time of our arrival, and the team that divides the "sweet treats" assembles the gift packages. Last year we also went to each house before that evening to place a reflective marker. It is amazing how challenging it is to find some homes after dark, so this helps. We start early enough so that, to be considerate, we don't arrive at any house past 8 pm.

There was a large turnout of carolers last year, and we hope to have as many, if not more. Usually we sang outside the home (the same carols each time for simplicity), while in a few cases our resident was in a hospital bed, so some carolers entered the home to sing. The entire experience is quite moving for all.

If you would like to contribute some homemade treats for this activity, our team will certainly make sure they are given to the residents in the homes we visit. They can be dropped off at my home, 6231 Spring Lake Circle, between Dec.19th and 21st. By then we will know the final numbers required, and the assembly can all be done for the Sunday, Dec. 22nd.

I want to thank everyone in advance, as so many helped in the past to organize and make this type of tradition a success. I hope this will be one of the many activities in our park that brings the true joy and peace of Christmas.

With your help, we will try our best to get to many residents who need some extra Christmas cheer. It is difficult to predict at this time how many homes we will visit, or what streets will be part of our route. Perhaps other groups might do some caroling too, but hopefully many of you can join us on Sunday Dec. 22nd from 5:30-8:00 pm.
