Forest Lake Estates Homeowners' Association (FLE HOA) President

I hope everyone is enjoying their winter at FLE. The weather has been a little spotty at times, but it looks like we are now having a pattern of consistent sun and warmer weather. The way life should be! Our annual HOA general meeting was held on Feb 14th. We had a great showing of over 200 HOA Member families.



Vince Boido presented Jim Dill with a plaque for his service and direction during his tenure as

President of the FLE Home Owner's Association. Jim also said a few words and received a standing ovation. Congratulations Jim and enjoy your retirement.

Steve Bagiardi gave his update from ELS on community issues. He announced that he has been promoted to Regional Manager of Florida Southwest area. His territory will be Sarasota on south. We wish Steve the best of luck in his new position. The transition should take 4 to 6 weeks. Our regional manager Sydney Morris is in the process of hiring a new manager for FLE.

I introduced the two new board members: Vic Bitel and Mike Reid. Please give them a warm welcome. I am sure both will work very well with the current members of the board. I was very pleased to see the 3 incumbents voted in as well: Trudy Ansel (Treasurer), Wendy Coache (Secretary) and Mark Matthews (Director).

At the annual HOA Meeting we reviewed and approved two key items:

We presented the 2019 budget for general operations and social activities. After discussion of the budget, the general membership unanimously approved the budget.

Per our bylaws, Jackie Black, Brad Dore and Julie Fisher conducted a detailed audit of the HOA 2018 books. The audit team reviewed receipts, disbursements, and bank accounts for the General Fund and the Social Fund. Their review showed that all the documents reflected an accurate

account of both FLE HOA accounts for 2018. The Audit Team recommended including the two cash boxes used for ticket sales be included in the audit. The general membership voted unanimously to approve the audit.

We all received our rent increase letters from ELS at the end of January. Effective May 1, 2019, former shareholders rent will increase by 4% and former nonshareholders rent will increase by 5%. Those residents at "Market Value" have also been increased by 5%. This year Pasco County broke out the taxes into

Message from Vince Boido

Happenings Editor and FLE HOA Vice President

Somebody once said "Rules were made to be broken." Well right now, we have two controversial issues in the park—dogs and speeding and it seems these rules have been broken.

There has been a lot of discussion and we've brought the concerns to ELS. It is not the responsibility of the HOA Board to police this park. We do not decide who passes background checks and we do not decide whose dog is a comfort dog or not (as opposed to Service Dogs). The park rules state that a resident cannot have more than 2 **pets** whose **combined** weight cannot exceed 40 lbs. and certain aggressive breeds are not allowed at all. I personally don't have a solution for this. If you think you have a solution, please contact me. Most of us have cell phones with a camera. If you see a situation where someone is breaking the rules, take a picture and send it to the office. If you feel you have a legitimate concern, please fill out a concern form and bring it to the office. When you do so, make sure it gets signed by office personnel and you get a copy for yourself.

Regarding speeding and running stop signs, we don't want the Pasco County Sheriffs patrolling our park. ELS has stated this will happen if the traffic violations don't improve. A lot of complaints are coming from dog walkers because their dogs are not on short leashes and there is a danger they will run out onto the streets. Please keep your dogs under control when you are walking them. Bikers and golf carts also must follow the rules of the road.

Please just pay attention to all the rules (and there aren't that many). Obey the 15 mph speed limit...the next time you're driving through the park, look down at your speedometer and see how fast you are going. And when you approach a Stop Sign, please stop. If you have an illegal dog, I suggest you find another home for it or keep it in the house so you are not infringing on others.

And each month I am taken aback to learn more and more about the diversity of the individuals with whom I speak.

This month's Resident of the Month for March proved to be no exception. I've known both Dick and Mary Mahon for a while now... as residents in our park, but had never taken the time to get to know either of them on a personal note. Turns out... while the chosen Resident of the Month is generally one individual, it seems a spouse or significant other has played a large part in each one's life. And again, as I came to interview Dick , I quickly learned that he and Mary are no exception there either as Mary has profoundly impacted Dick's life since the day he first laid eyes on her in high school. As he says, "it was love at first sight!"

Dick was born in Watertown NY on 2/13/1942 and graduated from Watertown High School in 1961. He was the typical high school "jock"... an active participant in most school sports, but favoring Basketball, LaCrosse, and Baseball. In 1958-59 he was All American Player of Jefferson County and participated on a local traveling baseball league. He met Mary, his wife and the love of his life while out cruising with a friend when they spotted Mary and a friend on the tennis court. Without hesitation, they stopped the car, interrupting their game with flirtatious conversation and invited the girls to join them for a ride. The girls accepted and the rest is history.
