

The idea of connecting with, and showing respect for some unique individuals who have given so much to Forest Lake Estates, is one I value, and hope can increase each day as we, "try a little kindness". With the blessing of my friend Judy Thiese, this month, I will try my best to convey to you what I learned about Dan Ward. I hope that those who know Dan better, will share their stories of this very special man, for years to come.

Periodically one finds themself in the presence of a person who immediately makes you feel welcome and surrounded by kindness. For me this happened the other day, when I accompanied his good friend, Judy Banack, to the beautiful home of Dan and Sophia Ward. Sadly, Sophia, fondly called Sophie, had fallen four days before, and was recovering in the hospital. Dan, despite his own physical challenges, was there to greet us with the dearest of



smiles. I knew Dan's name and face, and was aware that for many years, he and Sophie have been an integral part of the Forest Lake Estate's community, but I had never had the pleasure of actually sitting and talking with him. I feel I became more aware of someone who has given so much of his time and talent, to ensure we can all enjoy this beautiful community today.

Dan was born in Detroit 88 years ago. He and one brother were raised by loving parents, who were of Irish descent. Dan is a devout Catholic to this day, and served for many years as a Lector and a Eucharistic Minister at St. Joseph Church, here in Zephyrhills. While growing up in Detroit, Dan met his future wife, Sophie, at a parish CYO dance. Though she had "many suitors", according to Dan, she chose him. Perhaps, Dan surmised, being of Ukrainian descent, Sophie's Mother, wasn't so sure of the wisdom of the combination, but once the first grandchild was born, this Irish/ Ukrainian union was fully embraced by all. Two more children followed, so Dan and Sophie were blessed with two boys and a girl. After 67 years, their loving marriage has certainly stood the test of time. Their dedication to each other continues, "in sickness and in health".

Equipped with a degree in Accounting, Dan's working career was spent, first in private industry, but mostly working for the IRS, doing statistical work and handling the payroll for all Detroit IRS employees. His responsible nature and financial skills continued to be valuable assets, once he retired and moved to Forest Lake Estates.

Dan and Sophie started off by renting a home in Forest Lake Estates for two seasons, followed with buying a home here. Once he retired from the IRS, and Sophie retired as a secretary for an architect, they moved to Forest Lake Estates full time. Little did Dan know, he was going to be involved in many challenging situations, while many others could sit back and just "enjoy" retirement. With Sophie's support, and being a positive thinker, a leader, a retired navy man in the early '50s, and one who never backed down from a challenge, Dan Ward, was one of the homeowners who helped negotiate the purchase of the park in 1999. They formed the "Co-op", which was a relatively new concept in park ownership. Following a series of management changes, and some very daunting financial challenges, Dan and many others in the park continued to build a beautiful community, and saw an incredible increase in its appraised value. Dan served in various capacities on the Co-op board, including President, Vice-president, and Treasurer.

Dan reminisced about all the wonderful times he and Sophie have enjoyed over the years, especially living here in their retirement. He said that he doesn't get out much anymore, but was happy for their travel time, which consisted of about six incredible trips to Saipan to visit their daughter, and her family. He feels blessed to have his daughter and son-in-law living closer now, as they, and community friends, have been so supportive.

He smiled also while talking about the fun of playing golf, Euchre at the clubhouse, helping with dinner/dances, and of course, so many "good parties with such great friends". I could tell by his positive phrasing that Dan is a person who chooses to remember the good in people and events. Everything else he said is, "water under the bridge". 
