Message from the Desk of Jim Dill

Forest Lake Estates Homeowners' Association (FLE HOA) President

It is hard to believe that within the next 6-8 weeks many of our northern family and friends will be heading home for the summer. Where has the time gone? It seems just like yesterday when they all got here. It has been a wonderful winter here in Forest Lake Estates and we have had a very successful year for your Home Owner's Association (HOA). We held our annual HOA meeting on Feb 8th.



At the annual HOA Meeting we reviewed and approved several key items:

- We presented the 2018 budget for general operations and social activities. We have a budget of almost \$80,000 this coming year. After discussion of the budget, the general membership unanimously approved the budget. This budget gives the HOA a lot of flexibility this coming year.
- Per our bylaws, Jerry Wilson, Ralph Bechtold, and Mark Grassbaugh conducted a detailed audit of the HOA 2017 books. The audit team reviewed receipts, disbursements, and bank accounts for the Legal Fund, the General Fund, and the Social Fund. Their review showed that all the documents reflected an accurate account of all FLE HOA accounts for 2017. The general membership voted unanimously to approve the audit.
- We all received our rent increase letters from ELS at the end of January. Effective May 1, 2018, former shareholders rent will increase by 4% and former non shareholders rent will increase by 5%. Also, our 2018 county taxes will increase to \$51.26 for all residents. Director Rob Faulkner presented the Board recommendation to the general membership: that we accept the increase as proposed by ELS and not try to negotiate this increase this year. After we answered several questions, a majority of the general membership agreed to the motion. We will prepare letter to ELS asking them to provide the comparison data they used to justify the increase and letting them know we will accept the rent increase. Also, we will advise ELS that we are interested in discussing a multiple year rent agreement in 2019.

I want to personally thank Toni Beaton and Ralph Bechtold for their support to the HOA Board this past year. They have some big shoes to fill but we do have an outstanding board for 2018. Also, Eileen Lane turned in her resignation due to personal issues. Eileen did an outstanding job bringing together all our activities and ensured we had a better summer program last year. Thanks to all for your great support.

FLEing Life

It's February and we are in the middle of serious Snowbird Season here in FLE. Of course our year-round residents get to sample the many aspects of FLE life for twelve months and some of them may shake quizzical heads at those of us who interlope into their life during the winter months. Some may even pine and pray for the calendar's pages to flip with greater speed and sometimes the pages accede to their wish.

We are blessed with so many positives during our time here and many of these involve a variety of antics, both planned and spontaneous.

On Wednesdays putt-putt golfers begin to gather at our most excellent facility between the tennis courts, shuffle courts and post office. The stated time is 3:30, but with all things FLE folks come down an hour early. If spoken by the hubby the ones with a brain in their head insert a quick "honey", "How could you miss that putt...honey?" in order to soften the blow that they're about to receive. Sometimes it works and sometimes...well!!!!

Vince, with his buddy Jim B., run a tight ship. It is best that golfers become familiar with the rules and regulations beforehand so as not to run afoul of them, whether intentional or not. Vince and Jim are quite kind and usually react with rolled eyes and a smile to some of the infractions.

Winter driving here at FLE has perils as well and, of course, I'm not talking about ice and snow. For you newcomers to a 55+ community pay attention to what follows. During the serving time some one came into the kitchen in order to tell us what we were doing wrong. Jimmy promptly informed the lad that he needed to leave now and his leaving was not a negotiable item. He left and we continued on with our job, which resulted in 240 dinners being served piping hot in 12 minutes.



Sometimes the dancing that is exhibited can require the on-site services of medical personnel. This is especially true during and after the playing of any Chubby Checker "twist" tune or a polka. Body parts, in various stages of wear, are sometimes strewn about the dance floor.

Today, you reaffirm your pledge to each other as partners in marriage.



wish they could have been here. It was very emotional as we said our vows (with tears running down my face). We are having a reception with a brunch and champagne (our first toast) and


toast or first dance. It was just simple and we were young.



Today, I am feeling so grateful for the opportunity to write this column. Each month I have the pleasure of inviting myself into a neighbor's home and asking some sometimes very personal questions about their personal lives... who are they? What brought them to FLE? How long have they lived here? Where did they come from? How old are they and how many years married or how many children, grandchildren, etc. etc. etc. And it never fails to surprise and impress me how very interesting each one is and what stories each could tell.

Meet Mildred & Dick Fox of Spring Lake Circle! First, in July they will celebrate their 68th wedding anniversary!

They have no children but are very close to and very proud of their 37 nieces and nephews. Mildred & Dick came to Florida from Flint, Michigan. They first met in 1934 when Mildred was in kindergarten and Dick in second grade in Mayville, Michigan and both graduated from Mayville High ... Dick in 1945 qnd Mildred in 1947. After graduation, Dick went to work for Consumers Power in Flint working in the Engineering Department until he was laid off in 1948. In 1949 he was hired into the Chevrolet Manufacturing Plant. Meanwhile, Mildred worked as a clerk, salesperson, or bookkeeper for numerous local businesses in Mayville and surrounding towns. On January 2nd, 1950 Dick & Mildred shared their 1st date and after a short courtship became engaged and then married at the Lutheran Church in Mayville. Dick was drafted into the Korean Conflict on February 20, 1951 and spent 2 years at various Army locations in the USA. Upon discharge in February 1953, Dick returned to his job with General Motors while Mildred worked at Day-Fox Industry as a machine operator in Mayville. In 1954 Dick was transferred to the Chevrolet V-8 plant as a production supervisor where he worked until 1960 when he was transferred once again and assigned to Labor Relations in the Personnel Department. Dick & Mildred lived in various locations in Mayville for 14 years with Dick making the arduous & tiresome long drive daily to work in Flint. In April, 1964, they moved to Flint where they still call home today. After 20 years as Labor Relations Representative, Dick retired July 1, 1980 thus ending a lucrative thirty-one and one half years with General Motors.

Since retirement they have enjoyed traveling, playing cards, attending Detroit Tigers games, working jigsaw puzzles, walking and visiting family, friends, & neighbors both here at FLE and in Michigan. Upon retirement, Dick & Mildred had as many as fifteen friends & family members who would come south mid winter to the warmer Florida climate in Port Richey. Mildred & Dick would eventually join them, at first visiting, until in 1982 when they bought their 1st Florida home. Both enjoyed going to the baseball games and travel to and fro required traveling thru Zephyrhills.

Mildred's cousins, Russell & Arlene Hopp lived at FLE and introduced them to FLE Founder, Henry Viau. In November 1989 they ordered their new home and on January 2, 1990 they took residence on Spring Lake Circle, where they remain today.
