- We are waiting on ELS to announce the 2019 Capital Expenditure projects. They should announce these around the first of January. Steve submitted two for us this year. The first is a new walk-in cooler and freezer in the kitchen. This will replace several freezers and cooler that are getting old and expensive to repair. It will also free up some badly needed space for storage. The second project is to replace all the poles and fencing for the tennis courts.
- ♦ The new canopy is now installed over the outdoor fitness area. It looks really nice. Also, we just completed the storage area behind the kitchen for the trash bins. These bins are for club house use only and not for residential use. Trash pick up will go to 4 days a week starting the first week of November.
- ♦ Steve announced that they are still planning on breaking ground for the new admin office, indoor fitness center, and 30+ new homes by the end of the year. He is still looking for options for the RV Storage area, but have not come up with any solutions at this time.
- We will be holding FLE HOA Election in January 2019. We have 4 positions open for election this year. Three will be for a 3-year term and one will be for a 2-year term. If you are interested in submitting your name for the election, please contact Nancy Matthews or any Board Member.
- We are working with a local vendor to install a new digital jukebox in the clubhouse. We will be able to use this for many activities and functions. We hope to get it installed within the next month or so.
- ♦ The new rules and regulations went into effect on October 17, 2018. However, we are still working with ELS on the right wording for alcohol consumption in the park. The way it is now written we will have to get permission every time we consume alcohol in any common area. I sent a letter to ELS higher management in mid-September asking them to consider new wording that the working team and ELS had previously approved. Will send out email as soon as we get the new alcohol wording. Finally, we will be conducting our annual Veterans' Day Ceremony in Memorial park on November 12th. Since the holiday comes on a Sunday, we will celebrate the same day that our country does. Please mark your calendars now. It will be a very nice ceremony.

All of our fall and winter activities will begin in late October and early November. Please look at your calendar for all upcoming events. Our Social Director and Activities Director are working very hard to make this a great year. We will also have a Thanksgiving Dinner. Bob and Carol Ann Branquet have graciously agreed to be the host again this year. All our Canadian friends put on the best ever Thanksgiving last year and this year will be just a spectacular. Also, I announced at the meeting that I will be stepping down as HOA President at the January meeting. It is time for others to take over for me. It has been fun and a lot of work. I will remain on the Board for one more year and help with the transition. Safe travels to all those heading south and let the fun begin!!!

RENT: I would like to remind everyone that rent is due on the 1st of the month and LATE on the 5th of the month. Checks are made payable to Forest Lake Estates at 6429 Forest Lake Drive, Zephyrhills, FL 33540. Also, if mailing checks from out of state or out of country, PLEASE allow adequate time for the rent to be received here in the office. (We have found that it takes WEEKS to and from Canada) It will be counted as late and you will incur a \$25.00 late fee if it is not in this office by 5pm on the 5th of the month. Also, if you have any questions regarding site rent in general, please come to the office to get the best information.

TREES: I would like to remind everyone that if a Live Oak tree is touching the home as determined by Management, we will trim the Live Oak tree off of the home at our discretion. If the Live Oak tree is deemed dead, or dangerous, Management will remove the Live Oak tree. Residents are responsible for all other trees on their site and must maintain them at their expense. Most trees on a resident's site were there when you (the current resident) purchased the home, and you therefore adopted this tree and accepted the responsibility of maintaining it. If a resident wants to remove a tree on their site at their own expense, it must still be approved by Management and the County.

SIDEWALKS: Per the new rules and regulations, the repair of the sidewalks from natural damages such as tree roots, natural settling, etc will be the responsibility of the park. It will be YOUR RESPONSIBILITY as the homeowner to keep the sidewalk free of any debris and clutter, AS WELL AS CLEAN AND PRESSURE-WASHED! Please be sure to add "Pressure-washing the sidewalk" to the list when having someone pressure-wash or do any general maintenance to your home. This will lighten and freshen up the community greatly!


