Message from the Desk of Rick Schlager

Forest Lake Estates Homeowners' Association (FLE HOA) President

A BIG welcome back to all the FLE snowbirds. It is that time of year when many of our Northern friends migrate to the warmth and pleasant weather of Florida. The month of October has been a busy time for the HOA board to start planning for the winter activities and for ELS to prepare the commu-



nity property for the busy winter season. Trimming of trees, gardening and pressure washing are just a few of the tasks that Danny and Kaleb have been performing over the last few weeks.

We had our first General HOA meeting on Thursday October 10th. There were approximately 170 residents attended the meeting. Mike Black was introduced as a new board member and the board acknowledged and thanked Vic Bitel for his service and contributions to the board. Wendy has sent out the minutes to that meeting.

A number of things have been happening in the community.

- 1. The 2019 Capex project to replace the tennis court fence was completed during the summer.
- 2. Aerators in the lake are working well after maintenance of the compressors was completed by ELS.
- 3. The new gate system should be started soon. There will be two (2) entrance gates in the front of FLE and one (1) exit lane. One gate will be used exclusively for residents. It will have an activated arm that will rise and lower based on the vehicle length. No other vehicle will be able to follow behind a resident's entry into the park. The other gate will be used for visitors. The guard shack will be removed removed and paving will be done twice, once before the installation of the gates and again once the gates are in place. As we get more information, we will let everyone know.
- 4. Please be advised that there is a slight depression in the middle of the road on Viau Way. It is located between lots 693 and 696. Residents at those lots still have access to their homes and driveways. It has been cordoned off with tape and road barriers. This was the result of a broken storm drain. Please be patient as this could take quite a while to fix.
- 5. At our General meeting there were a number of complaints about the cleanliness of the big pool. I talked to Peggy on Friday and she had the staff work on the issues. The sides of the pool and the steps contained some light green algae in many places. Danny and Kaleb scrubbed the steps, scrubbed the inside walls and cleaned all the blue tiles that surround the pool. The quality of the water was not affected as Stewart makes sure it is well above the minimum standards of Pasco County. The staff will now scrub the pool Monday, Wednesday and Friday instead of the once per week scrubbing.



You may choose to have a hardcopy newsletter delivered to. your home November to April Newsletters are only delivered in the summer to members without email.

From the desk ofJudy Thiese

There is seldom a day passes that I am not in some manner reminded what a small world we live in. Yesterday was no exception, when I realized that this gentleman whom I met for the first time, and I, had a common friend from my hometown, Cheboygan, Michigan. Today, I am pleased to introduce my new friend to you...

MELVIN EDWARD RATZ (Mel) resides at 5635 Viau Way, here in Forest Lake Estates. Mel, as he prefers to be called, is 84 years young, delivered by Mid-wife, March 22, 1935 in Gilett, Wisconsin, the youngest of 15 children.

Mel has resided here in FLE for just 2 years. Asked what brought him to Zephyrhills and Forest Lake Estates, he said his sister (Mavis) and her husband (Roy Lamke, both now deceased) and friends who also lived in the area. He had lived in Silver Oaks years earlier, but returned to Ohio due to his wife's failing health. Mavis was instrumental in his return to Forest Lake Estates where he now maintains his beautifully landscaped home on Viau Way.



Graduating from high school, Mel decided he did not want to be a farmer like his father, so in 1954, after a brief internship at the local funeral home, and deciding that wasn't for him, he joined the United States Air Force. After Basic Training at Lackland AFB in San Antonio, Texas, he went on to Tech School in Cheyenne, Wyoming, training in Administration. After Tech School he was assigned to Moulans, France where he spent the next 3 years before taking an early release and taking a construction job with his brother-in-law in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. But work was slow and he was laid off, so in 1957 he re-enlisted with the USAF and was assigned to K I Sawyer AFB in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan working directly for the Base Commander. Personalities being what they are, he and the Commander found themselves with different ideas about the job and Mel contacted Personnel to volunteer for overseas duty. He was reassigned to Frankfurt, Germany, but after learning Mel was fluent in German, was only there for 1 week before being reassigned to Berlin. There, his Administrative duties included handling refugees at Tempehof AFB in West Berlin where he met a "SPOOKS"...... (Mel couldn't remember the exact acronym meaning but said it was an "Intelligence type person") when he was sent to the Commissary to obtain cartons & cases of cigars, cigarettes, and Vodka, Bourbon, & Gin. It was a short time later when he was reassigned, now to Potsdam East Germany with a unit called the US Military Liaison Mission. This was a small unit consisting of a mix of US Air Force, Army, Navy & Marines with 5 NCO's (Non-commissioned Officers) and 9 Officers who were authorized by Treaty to travel throughout East Germany serving basically as "spies". The Russians and Germans also by virtue of Treaty, also had military personnel performing similar duties. After 4 years in Potsdam, Germany, he was reassigned in 1961 to Special Securities Operation in Japan where he spent the next 3 years before returning to the USA and being assigned to Scott AFB, 25 miles East of St. Louis. Throughout all these travels and reassignments, US Military had frozen all promotions with few exceptions and Mel held the rank of E3 Airman. While serving at Scott AFB, the freeze was lifted and before being reassigned to the Attache's office in Stockholm, Sweden, where having been promoted to the rank E5 Staff Sergeant, he would report directly to the US Ambassador to Sweden. He was there for 2 ½ years before once again returning to the USA for duties at Headquarters Secret Service in San Antonio, Texas for Special Operations where he spent the next 2 years. He didn't like it there and asked to be reassigned. Over the next 6 years he was reassigned to Potsdam, Germany with similar duties and travel as before, before being called to duty at the US Pentagon. Once again, dissatisfied with the assignment, Mel called Personnel asking for reassignment and for the 3rd time, was reassigned to Potsdam where he spent the next 4 years before being called into the US Army as Intelligence Specialist Civil Service GS13 rank, equivalent to a Major with duties at US Army Intelligence Headquarters in Berlin. There, he was responsible to review the reports coming from military personnel assigned to Potsdam, Germany, the very reports, he once created.

After 24 years of service to our country, Mel retired at Wright Air Force Base, Dayton, Ohio before moving with his wife to Martha's Vineyard, in Massachusetts where they had friends. Due to family health problems and after only 3 years, they returned to Ohio where sadly his wife passed.
