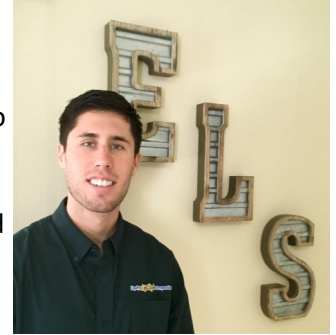

## Message from Steven Bagiardi Forest Lake Estates General Manager



Dear Residents,

As many of you are aware, there have been growing concerns regarding traffic violations throughout Forest Lake Estates. Specifically, speeding and the running of stop signs. I am also concerned, and I need your help. In every community I have managed, and probably throughout the country, there are speeders. This is not something that is new or unexpected, but it's something I have taken seriously for the safety of our community. I need for you all to do the same.



Since ELS has taken over this community, we have taken several different measures in attempts to reduce speeding throughout the community. We have created several 4-way stops. We have added additional speed limit signs throughout the community to make sure all residents know the speed limit. We have also brought up the issue of speeding at general meetings, and expressed our desire for residents to reduce their speed. We have even purchased a radar gun and have been tracking speeds in order to help make residents aware of their contribution to the problem.

We are running out of options to create a solution to this problem. It is my responsibility to ensure every resident's safety and address their concerns. We are looking into renting a portable speed limit radar feedback sign that can be moved throughout the park and will give real time feedback to residents as they drive the streets. If the speeding continues to be an issue after this, we will be forced to grant the Pasco County Sherriff access to the park so that they can help us solve this problem. I spoke with the Sherriff's office and they require an all or nothing agreement from us. This means that we cannot allow them to come in and simply write speeding tickets or monitor stop sign usage. If we allow them to patrol the community, they will look at everything. They will not allow open alcohol containers on golf carts. They will look for seat belts in all types of vehicles. They will sit outside the clubhouse and monitor people leaving dinner dances after drinking alcoholic beverages...All of these infractions and many more will result in legitimate fines and/or even worse. This is not something I want for the community, but if we can't reduce the speeding, it is our last option.

This month, Russ Kubara sent the letter below regarding bulletin board space.

## **Letter to the Editor**

In the past ten years I have seen our community bulletin board space shrink to almost nothing.

There was a large message center to the East of the post office that ELS removed because of the condition. This was never replaced. We also had a small message center to the West of the Post Office. It was also removed and not replaced.

The HOA bulletin board at the clubhouse is locked. So is the small message center at the post office.

The bulletin board in the screen room that has traditionally been for residents to post want ads has been taken over by house listings and business advertising, with a six inch column allotted for items for sale.

Activities have been designated one small bulletin board in the screen room (where very few people go) and it is often taken up by posters that are meant to stay up all year! Outside events also post here as there is nowhere else for them unless they have a contact with ELS or the HOA.

Music in the Park purchased their own bulletin board but it is often used by other activities. They have also purchased their own sandwich boards to post signs by the Post Office.

In Past years I have submitted a request for a new message center to the Coop, Social Club, ELS, and the new HOA. This has been discussed but never acted on.

The HOA has funds that they inherited from the FLENS and from the Forest Lake Social club that they have said will be used to support activities. Signs and posters located near the Post Office is the most effective way to communicate with the whole community. An unlocked message center would achieve that goal.

Is this an ELS responsibility or an HOA obligation? The future plans for the post office was reasoning given for not acting on this in 2018. If future plans require it to be moved then move it!!

**This issue will be discussed at January 2019's board meeting. The 2019 budget will be put into place and your HOA board will try to come up with a solution that will cover all the topics discussed in Russ' letter.**

## EVERYDAY BLESSINGS

The holidays are over and a new year just beginning. The greater majority of us here at Forest Lake Estates are seniors who've been blessed in many ways throughout our lives... through our families... our children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, and our extended families, our siblings and their families. Our many friends bring us daily blessings in many ways through their words of advice, comfort and encouragement. They're there for us when we need them, in our social lives or when we need help. I think we can all admit we are truly blessed in so many ways and fortunate to live in a community where we have so much.



But there are many who are not so fortunate as we. Everyday Blessings is the name of an adoptive foster care facility for children who have been removed from their homes by court order due to abuse or neglect. Their mantra is "Where Miracles Happen for Kids!" It is located just 8 miles south of Chancey Rd. off Hwy 301 in Thonotosassa. The children are all ages from birth to 18. This particular site fosters as many as 28 children at any one time. At present, the facility consists of a building which may once have been an old school house and now houses 7 families consisting of one "house parent" and four children. The children when removed from their parental care are never separated from their siblings although they might live with different house parents as boys room together and girls do also. What might once have been a gymnasium is now a family center where all gather daily for meals and social events. The house parent is responsible as any parent would be to get the children up each morning for breakfast and then on to school. They take them to the doctor or dentist as needed and are there for the children after school to help with homework, eat dinner with, and see that their daily hygiene needs are met before tucking them into their beds at night. Blessings come in many forms. While these children are blessed to have their daily needs met, they lack the love and support that we often take for granted with our own families. They are blessed with caring house parents in a safe environment and a staff, kitchen staff and administrative staff who aspire to make their lives better.

For my column this month I have been asked not to write about any one specific person, but of the many who gathered together both socially and productively in an effort to do what we could to support these children. I'm talking about the group of artists who gathered at the home of Christine & Vince Boido on what became over a period of months an almost daily vigil to draw & paint ornaments, wine glasses and canvases to be sold at the FLE craft fair in December. I was asked to list their names, but am reluctant to do so in fear of leaving even one person out of accolades well deserved. Those of us... and there were many, who worked so diligently the many, many hours of artistic creation were also blessed. New friendships were made and old friendships renewed as we worked together for these kids. And our work paid dividends when through our art and a few donations, we made \$1,000.00 to benefit these children at the Everyday Blessings. I am so very proud of these artists and what they've done to help these kids.

Everyday Blessings, Inc. is a 501C3 charity I personally have supported all my years here at Forest Lake Estates. I learned about them through another group of artists here in Zephyrhills. Everyday Blessings also hosts a "Springboard Program" for young adults who have aged out of foster care and would otherwise be facing homelessness and uncertain transitions into adulthood. This program provides a furnished apartment, mentoring, counseling, and real-world life skills and is the only program of its kind in the state of Florida. For more information regarding Everday

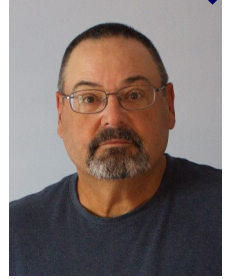
# Meet the Candidates

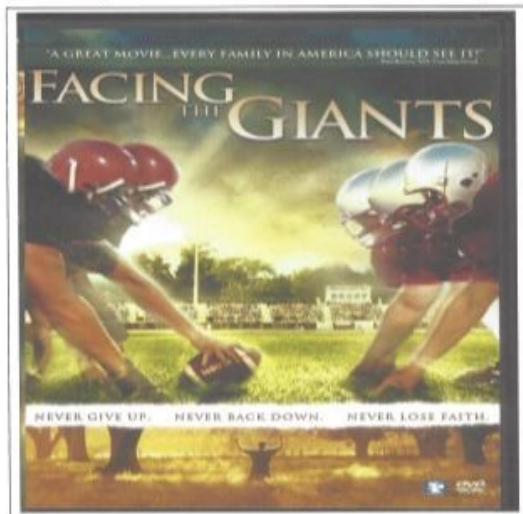

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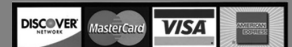
