Editorial

In last month's article, resident concerns were discussed. Your advice on solving some of these problems were very helpful. Three areas of concern are addressed. Dog issues, Road Issues, and Swimming Pool which always seems to be an issue.

Committees are being formed, Dog Patrol, Road Patrol, and Pool Volleyball Patrol.

Dog Patrol: The committee will go house to house-similar to that of a 360 degree inspection. Dog breeds, weights, and proper support dog paperwork will be documented. (See picture).

Road Patrol: Speeding over 15 miles per hour and not stopping at stop signs will be enforced by written warnings and possible monetary fines.



Pool Volleyball Patrol: Pool volleyball here at FLE is quite popular. Any day that sees temperatures

in the 80 degree range will draw a horde of enthusiastic volleyballers. This causes a problem of overcrowding on the court. Beginning on April 1st the following regulations will be in effect. When the temperature reaches 79 degrees, split volleyball session shall take hold. Those living in/on odd numbered lots shall play from 12:30 until 2:00 PM. Those in/on even numbered lots shall play from 2:01 until 3:31 PM. This should cause an easing of overuse of the pool volleyball areas.

Emily Haynes and Jerry Wilson

It's that time again and this month I was invited into the home of Emily Haynes where Jerry Wilson joined us to talk about their lives together today and their lives independently previously. As the saying goes, "Behind every successful man, there stands an encouraging woman." Jerry Wilson was born in Troy, New York September 20, 1933, an only child saying his parents saw perfection and said that was enough!. He'll be 86 in September and states he is quite proud of that. Jerry attended St. Augustine Elementary School and went on to graduate from Lansingburg High School in 1952. Before graduating,

he joined the Naval Reserve in 1951 but didn't go on to active duty until 1953 in the midst of the Korean conflict.. Immediately after high school graduation, Jerry went to Barber School but wasn't able to complete his apprentice training before he was called to duty. With his Barber schooling behind him, he was assigned first to general enlistee duties aboard ship but when one of the ship's barbers retired, he was recruited to fill the slot in the Naval Barber Shop where he worked directly with the Supervising Barber on Duty to complete his apprentichis eship requirement and become a fully licensed Barber and left the Navy in 1955 as a 3rd Class Petty Officer . On departure from the Navy he

returned to his home in Troy, New York but wasn't able to find work in that area as it was primarily Italian and he was not Italian and therefore didn't speak the language. In 1961 he was able to open his own Barber Shop where he worked until retirement.



Jerry's father worked at the telephone company and bowled at the local bowling alley regularly. It was at the bowling alley where Jerry's father introduced him to a co-worker, Doris. It was love at first sight and in 1956 they married... a marriage that lasted just 2 days short of their 56th anniversary. Sadly Doris passed in 2012.

Together, Jerry and Doris had four children... 2 boys and 2 girls... Keith, 62 who lives in Seffner, FL with his wife Pat. Keith, as many of you may remember, worked as Vice President of Brightview Landscaping and Development and through that company was responsible the funding for our Memorial Park. Jerry & Doris's 2nd son Tod, works as a carpenter and lives with his wife Ann in Schenectedy, New York. Of the 2 girls, Kerri is the oldest and lives inTampa with her husband, William Fogg, daughter Ashley and son Bradford. Their 2nd daughter Traci is single, residing in Houston and working at Corporate Headquarters for "Charming Charlie's" as Senior Retail Director.

Jerry moved to Forest Lake Estates in October 1999 and remains active in our community today. Many of you might know Jerry as past President of FLENS for 5 years succeeded by Ralph Bechtel prior to the park sale to ELS. Upon the sale of the park to ELS, Jerry was recruited and eventually voted in as our 1st Vice President of our newly established FLE HOA. Today you might find Jerry in the kitchen, or helping out wherever he can with community events and often in the company of the woman in his life today, Emily Haynes.

Jerry first met Emily at the pool, here at FLE when she invited him to join her at the FLE Saturday night dinner dance. That evening was followed by a 2nd invitation to join her at a patio party here at FLE. The rest is history... while maintaining separate residences, they are seldom apart from one another for daily events.


Emily was born February 26, 1928 in Michigan City, Indiana, a twin sister to Zinib, who sadly passed away at age 85 in Ft. Lauderdale, FL. Emily was the last of 13 children weighing in at only 3 lbs. while twin sister, Zinib, was a healthy 8 lb. baby girl. Emily was always slight of build and as a result struggled during her public school years. Her parents immigrated from Beruit, Lebanon. Emily attended Arabic school where she learned the language and culture. On her

brother's advice, at age 20, she moved to Marine City, Michigan and took classes in Psychology there for 18 months. Emily worked in the parts department of Excelo Corporate Aviation and it was there she met her husband, who actually worked a later shift, but came in early to walk her off shift. On May 24, 1952, Emily married Carl W. Haynes. Carl worked as a Manufacturing Engineer at C-P-C Headquarters Design Group of B.O.C.. otherwise known at Buick, Oldsmobile and Cadillac. His areas of expertise were on fixture design, floor type automatic weld fixtures, side frame, robotics, design

contact and construction follow-up. He also participated in numerous Pilot and Start of Production Programs including Geometric Dimensioning and Tolerancing Training programs.

Together, Carl and Emily had 6 children consisting of 2 sets of twins and 2 single births and at one time 5 of those 6 children were under 5 years old! Robert lives in Alameda, California with his wife Selina



Emily and Carl also had 9 children and 10 great-grandchildren including 2 more sets of twins! Sadly, Carl, Emily's husband and father of her children, passed away on September 06, 1995, after 43 years of marriage.

When Emily and her husband first moved to FLE, Emily was not happy claiming she did not want to live in a mobile home park with a lot of "old" people! But Carl had retired and wanted to move to a warmer climate. Emily claims it took her about 2 years before she asserted herself socially. She loved the water and spent many hours poolside before becoming the water aerobics instructor, a position she held for 5-7 years before handing the reins to Twila and Angela and eventually Ruth, who continue the water aerobics program every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday in the big pool yet today.

Emily and Jerry can often be seen together on the PuttPutt course or at the Saturday night dinner dances and participate in many of the other recreational functions here at FLE. So when you see them, say hi... they can show you how to have fun at FLE!


