ELS Rent Negotiations 2019

We received a call from our ELS regional representative Sydney Morris. She told us that ELS upper management was no longer offering a 3 year long term agreement. She went on further to tell us that it would be 5% for a one (1) year rent renewal period, no discussion. This will be effective May 1, 2019.

The board convened a conference call with our lawyer Dan Perry on Wednesday April 17th at 7:00 pm. After lengthy discussion the board asked Dan to come to FLE to discuss available options with the general HOA and non HOA members. Since this is rent negotiations and it affects everyone in the community, all FLE residents will be invited to this meeting. The meeting is set for Thursday May 9th at 6:00 pm. We will distribute and post the minutes of this meeting to keep everyone informed of our progress.

ELS Re-Zoning of the 11-acre parcel in front of Forest Lake Estates

There is a Public Notice sign at the front entrance of FLE from Pasco County. It states that MHC Forest Lake Estates MH, LLC (ELS), the applicant, has requested a change in zoning from an A-C agricultural District to a R-M-H residential Mobile Home District. This has to do with the 11-acre parcel they want to develop into approximately 32 home sites. The meeting will be held on May 9th at 1:30 pm at the Historic Pasco County Courthouse, 2nd floor Board Room, 37918 Meridian Ave., Dade City, FL. This will be the first of two meetings, the first meeting being the Planning Commission and the second being on June 4th, at 1:30 pm by the Board of County Commissioners.

The FLE HOA Board is having a board meeting on Monday April 29th at 10:00 am to discuss the points we wish to bring up before the Planning Commission to stop this re-zoning. ELS has not been able to tell us how this expansion will affect the current 892 homeowners. We do not know the impact on our water supply, waste water treatment, where the dog park and storage barn will be relocated or why we have lost our ability to store vehicles/RV's in the storage area.

We will be having a resident meeting (all HOA and non-HOA members) on Thursday May 2nd at 10:00 am at the clubhouse. This meeting is extremely important and we would like as many residents as possible to attend. We will be going over our talking points for the May 9th meeting. We would also like as many residents to attend the May 9th meeting in Dade City to show the county commissioners that we mean business and are unified in our resistance to the re-zoning.

Bring Paper and cardboard to the bins near Post Office, behind the white fence.

<u>Cardboard must be broken</u> <u>down.</u> **NO** plastic bags, no Styrofoam, no garbage. Paper and cardboard only. **Glass, Plastic, Metal, Paper, Cardboard** The East Pasco Transfer Station accepts all recyclable material. No need to sort, dump all into one bin. Turn left out of park onto Pasco Co 54 W (becomes Eiland Blvd) Drive 6.9 miles, turn right onto 579N. (Handcart Rd) Go about 3.9 miles, station is on right. Furniture, and appliances for free.
